Since inception in 2012, WCM SheBiz has reached more than 6000 students and has been hosted in Toronto, Calgary, Montreal, Vancouver, and Victoria.

With less than 25% of females represented in business and STEM, we are educating the next generation on the rewarding careers in these fields, to help find a solution for this alarming imbalance in employment in these sectors. Disparity in representation also extends to BIPOC representation in STEM where Statistics Canada found that representation of Black STEM professionals falls significantly below the proportion of Black people in the Canadian population.

As students begin to make important decisions that will impact the direction of their education, such as course selections and applying for post-secondary studies, WCM's SheBiz aims to:

- educate high school students about the exciting and rewarding careers in STEM and business
- inspire them to enroll in the necessary math and other courses required for post-secondary education.

With amplification of this message, we aim to inspire more young women to enter into these exciting and rewarding careers.
